**Sponsored Walk**: Thanks to everyone who sponsored the children in the recent Sponsored Walk. Over 4000 thousand euro was raised. This money is earmarked for covering the cost of the new yard markings and the purchase of stop the ball nets for the basketball/soccer area which the older children use at break time.

**Stay Safe Programme:** Over the past few months the children in all classes have been doing the Stay Safe Programme. Please make sure to ask your child about what they are learning. It is important children have one phone number which they can remember in the event of getting lost/separated from family in any situation. It might also be helpful to write a phone number on an inside label of a jacket etc if children can't remember the number.

**Drumcondra Tests:** The standardised tests will be taking place during the coming weeks in this month of May. Please make sure your child is in school on time. If your child has an essential appointment and must leave early, please make sure to inform your child's teacher well in advance so this doesn't clash with testing schedule. Standardised test take place from 2<sup>nd</sup> class upwards and the children in 1<sup>st</sup> do screening tests. Results of standardised tests will be included in your child's report card later in June.

Attendance: As per the Attendance Policy please note the following:

- In order to minimise the disruption to teaching and learning, if you need to collect your child for an urgent appointment, please make sure to schedule collection for the break times ie 10:50 to 11:10 am or 12:50 to 1:10pm.
- Previously, we had a sign in/sign out book when your child was arriving late or leaving early whatever the reason. As we are now using the Aladdin Connect App, parents must notify the school via the App when their child is going to be **absent**, **late arriving** or **early leaving** before 2:50 pm. This notification must be sent in **by 9:10 am** on the day **VIA THE APP** and include time of arrival/departure and reason for same. All absences, whether whole day or part of a day must be accounted for due to Safeguarding obligations.

**School Closure:** The school will be closed on Friday June 23<sup>rd</sup> for further staff training in the new Primary Language Curriculum.
